Subject: RW-21 Piping installation (December 15 and 16)

Central Avenue/South Sheridan Avenue intersection closure continues

Central Avenue/North Sheridan intersection Closure Central Avenue westbound and turning lane closures

Emma Street Closure (N. Windhorst Ave to N. Herman Ave)

Northrop Grumman is providing this progress report to you on the installation of piping to support the RW-21 groundwater treatment system project. Work on our three well vaults is pending final inspection and power activation by PSEG.

Our schedule through December 16 is as follows:

Wednesday, December 15 and Thursday December 16: We will continue trench excavation/shoring and begin piping installation on Central Avenue. The two westbound lanes and the center turning lane of Central Avenue will be closed entirely until next Monday. Drivers should see additional barriers and flashing work zone lights overnight to clearly mark the construction zone. We thank everyone for their safe driving.

A small portion of Emma Street (between N. Windhorst Avenue and N. Herman Avenue) will remain closed to enable us to excavate and install shoring and replace a section of installed piping. We do not anticipate any impact to school bus routes. Work will be completed by 4:30 p.m. All work is weather dependent.

Vehicle movement during work hours: Drivers who use Central Avenue regularly are advised to use alternate routes to avoid traffic delays while this work is in progress.

Apollo Circle and Sunny Lane traffic control advisory: Residents living at Apollo Circle and Sunny Lane Senior Citizen complexes should expect to see similar traffic control signs at the intersection of Hickey Blvd. and Central Blvd. that were present during the piping installation along Hickey Blvd./Grumman Road East in the spring of 2020.

Grumman Road W/Hickey Blvd Cul-de Sac for Emergency Use Only: We are noticing that some drivers appear to be using the Grumman Road W/Hickey Blvd cul-de sac as a pass-through. Please be advised that this area is for emergency vehicle use only and should not be crossed. We will engage with Town of Oyster Bay traffic safety and Bethpage Fire Department for a solution on this emerging issue.

Updates to Bethpage School District Walkers/Bus Routes: We continue to routinely update Stacey Popkin from the Bethpage School District Transportation office on our project.

Pavement restoration on Emma Street: We will have another update in the coming weeks.

Work vehicles moving in and out of our staging areas: You may also observe our equipment vehicles entering and exiting our staging areas off Broadway south of Arthur Avenue, the east side of the Town Municipal Lot B-2 (Seaman Avenue), and the Hickey Blvd/Sunset Court intersection.

Utility work in the area: National Grid has ongoing residential efforts in the vicinity of our project work. Their work (and their own traffic control efforts) is unrelated to the Northrop Grumman pipeline installation and concerns about their work should be addressed to National Grid directly.
