

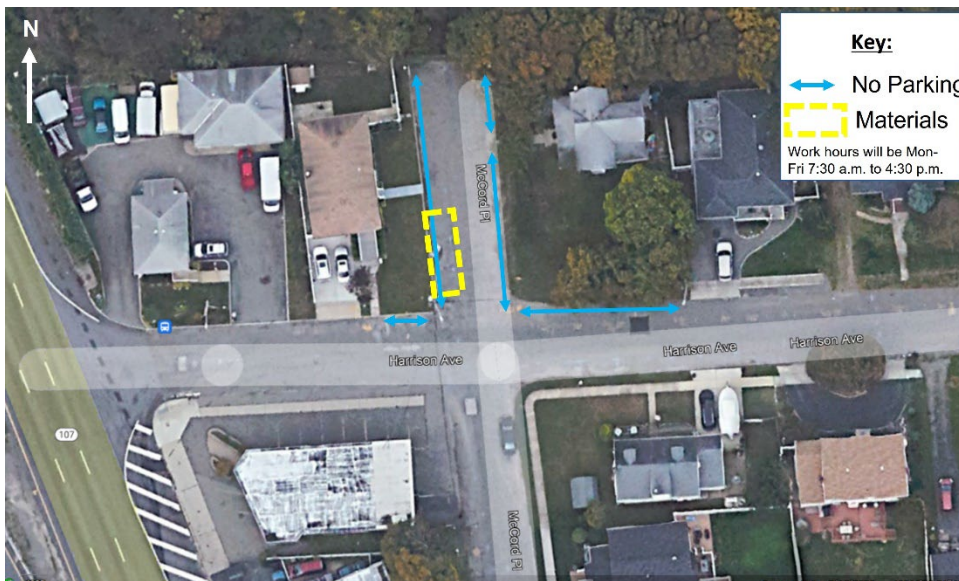

Subject: Water pipe installation on McCord Place begins this week
RW-21 well development and RW-22 Well Pump Installation Underway
Traffic Controls on Central Avenue remain in place

Northrop Grumman is providing this progress report to you on our activities in support of the RW-21 groundwater treatment system project and other associated environmental activities.

McCord Place Water Pipe Installation

Later this week, Bethpage Water District contractors will stage materials and equipment on the west side of McCord Place to support the installation of new water pipe that will service the RW-21 Groundwater Treatment System. We ask residents to refrain from parking vehicles on McCord Place



while the crews are conducting their work. Homeowners with driveways on McCord Place will continue to have access. Work hours are Monday through Friday, 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. At one point in the installation, BWD will temporarily shut off water service to complete the connection. Homeowners in the immediately affected area will be advised.

Well development and well pump installation progress

Our contractors continue to install the well pump on RW-22 in the greenway. Well development at RW-21 (located in the commuter parking lot on Seaman Avenue) is underway.

Asphalt settling along Central Avenue; traffic safety signage remains in place

Our traffic safety controls in Central Avenue (just east of Hickey Blvd) remain in place. We ask all drivers to exercise caution through this area while we work with our contractors to schedule repairs. Nassau County Department of Public Works and the Bethpage Water District are aware of the issue.

Phase 2 road striping along Central Avenue at Hickey Blvd.

We have postponed the final phase of painting until asphalt repairs along Central are complete (corresponds to item above).

Hydraulic pressure tests continue

Our contractors continue work on the hydraulic pressure testing of the piping that will carry water from the three wells into the treatment system. You should expect to see our crews working in our work zones during business hours.

Groundwater treatment system construction continues

Despite some supply chain challenges due to COVID-19, we continue to make solid progress on the construction of the groundwater treatment system.

Routine groundwater sampling and water level measurements underway

Our routine groundwater sampling and water level measurement program continues throughout the month of July and August at various locations. Residents near our work locations receive notifications.
